In Puerto Rico (as of July 2020)

- 102 suicides between January and July 2020 (a decrease in 20 cases in comparison with those registered between January and May of 2019).
- There has been a decrease since 2013.
- Average per year 2000-2019: 295 per year
- Average rate of 8.2 deaths per 100,000 residents
- More cases involving men than women.
- The highest incidentes are seen in the 40-69 age range.

Globally (https://www.who.int/es/news-room/fact-sheets/detail/suicide)

- 800,000+ people take their lives annually (1 each 40 seconds)
- There are more suicide deaths tan those caused by armed conflicts or car accidents.
- For every suicide completed there are 20 attempts
- 20 veterans commit suicide per day, on an average.



Prevenion and control - ACE

Ask: Have the courage to ask if the person wants to hurt herself/himself. Ask directly.

Care: Remove all means that coud be used for self-injury. Listen and calmly control the situation.

Escort: never leave the person alone.




